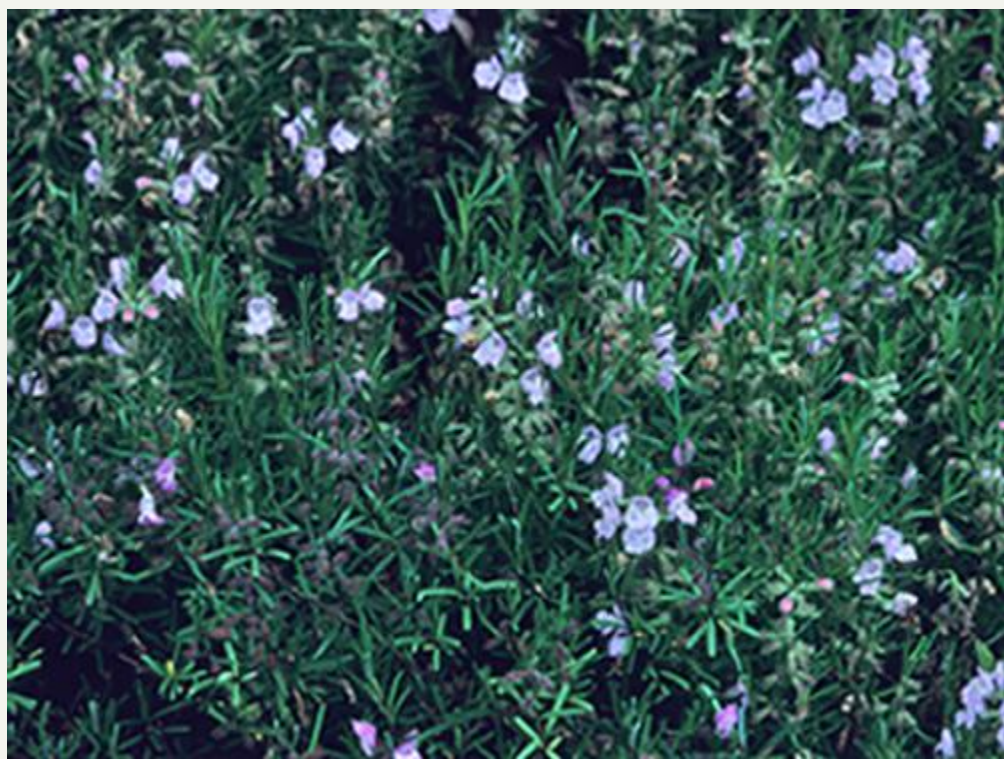




Cumberland false rosemary



Plant Botanical Name:

Conradina verticillata

Conradina verticillata closely resembles culinary rosemary, but it is a species native to the southeastern United States and is increasingly threatened in the wild. In its native habitat of well-drained sandbars and riverbanks, this plant is often associated with *Chionathus*, *Itea*, *Marshallia*, *gerardii*, and *Aster linarifolius*. Although federally listed, it is relatively easy to cultivate and a wonderful native plant for southern rock gardens, as are its close relatives.
